
Pastor's Message

Below is a summary of the total expenses and revenues in our Church's General Operating Fund through November of this year:

We are reporting a year-to-date negative cash flow with a shortfall of \$16,097.31 of revenue received versus expenses incurred in the General Operating Fund as of the end of the month.
